## **Advanced Skills Boost Local Economies**

Over 1.7 million community college students balance raising children with school. That's about one in four students in the community college sector. Juggling schoolwork and childcare is complicated, and it shows in the numbers—just 28 percent of student-parents earn a degree or certificate within six years of starting their programs.



Approximately **1 in 3 women** enrolled in community college are mothers, who cite the challenge of **finding adequate childcare as the chief barrier to finishing their education.** Approximately **40% of enrolled mothers** say they are **very likely to stop** out because of childcare challenges. Despite the situation, the number of **childcare services** on community college campuses **has dropped by 17%** in the last decade, making graduating even more difficult. Daniela Robles beat the odds by completing her associate's degree within two years while raising two young children, including a toddler on the spectrum. She graduated with honors and has been accepted by a four-year university. Student parents enrolled in college have higher grade point averages than those without children.
